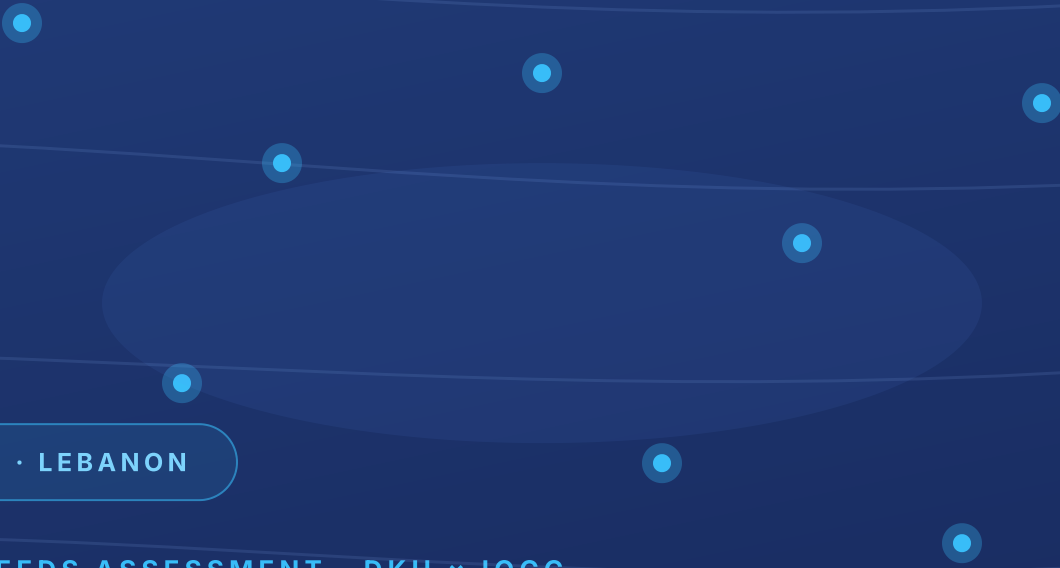

Lebanon's compounding crisis, *measured household by household.*

IOCC Lebanon collected the data across all eight governorates. Integrity Consulting turned it into evidence — the analysis, the assessment report, an interactive dashboard, and findings integrated into a DG ECHO proposal for DKH and IOCC.

WHY THIS WORK MATTERS

The world's highest refugee-to-resident ratio — and support is collapsing.

Protracted socioeconomic collapse, active conflict, and a ceasefire that let more than 918,000 people return to southern Lebanon — into damaged homes, stretched services, and an aid system losing funding fast.

OUR ROLE · FROM DATA TO DECISION

Data to report to dashboard to *proposal.*

A mixed-methods evidence base — 655 households representing 3,049 individuals (56% Lebanese, 44% Syrian), 12 focus groups with 162 participants, and 12 key-informant interviews — collected by IOCC field teams and turned by Integrity Consulting into instruments partners can act on.

ANALYSIS

One dataset, every population

Cleaned, weighted and analysed the full quantitative and qualitative dataset across all eight governorates — Lebanese host communities and Syrian refugees, side by side.

REPORT

The needs assessment, drafted end to end

From executive summary to priority recommendations: healthcare, food security, livelihoods, education, WASH, shelter and protection — each finding traced to its evidence.

DASHBOARD

Interactive, sector by sector

An interactive dashboard for exploring findings by sector, governorate and population group — the assessment as a working tool, not a PDF on a shelf.

PROPOSAL

Findings wired into the funding ask

The evidence base integrated directly into the DG ECHO proposal submission for DKH and IOCC — from needs data to programme design in one motion.

01

Healthcare is the unanimous priority.

56% of households needed care in the last three months; consultation fees of \$20–30 are prohibitive; medication shortages persist even where subsidised care exists.

02

Wages have collapsed.

Salaries lost 80–90% of purchasing power — from \$1,500 to \$300 a month — while rents of \$300–600 exceed what most households earn.

03

Families are coping through hunger.

Adults average 2.5 meals a day; parents routinely skip meals to feed children; community kitchens emerged as the most effective food modality.

04

People are staying, not leaving.

71.4% of Lebanese and 48.3% of Syrian respondents intend to remain where they are — long-term co-existence requires integrated, protection-sensitive programming.
